On August 23rd and 24th 2019, as an officer of one of the 53 Alsatian associations from all over the world, I attended the 38 th Journée annuelle des Alsaciens du monde, this year in Colmar.

Friday the 23rd was a working day. Gérard Staedel, President of the Union Internationale des Alsaciens called the presidents and representatives of the various Alsace associations to order. We first gathered in the lovely finde-siècle Chateau Kiener in Colmar. We were introduced to an ever-growing number of associations from the five continents, the latest being from Zurich, Chicago, The Ivory Coast, Dubai, Benin, Poland, and Marrakech. We also learned that in China, between Beijing, Shanghai, Shenzhen, and Hong Kong, there are now 150 members. The New York, Lausanne, and Paris associations will soon celebrate their 150th anniversary, having been created in 1871to help Alsatians to maintain their French identity after the Prussians annexed Alsace and Moselle in 1870.

At the meeting, we shared our events and experiences from the past year. We also brainstormed on how to grow and reinvigorate our associations. There were ideas such as an Alsatian Fan Day on July 24th, when all Alsatians and their friends would eat flammeküchen. Another proposal is to celebrate St. Nicholas on December 5th by everyone eating gingerbread mannele. Facilitating our bonhomie and imaginations was a delightful crémant offered as aperitif by J. Cattin, accompanied by kugelhopf.

The luncheon was held on the banks L'Etang Sainte-Croix, where Colmar's famous carps are caught. Roasted wild boar and other grilled meats were on the menu. In the afternoon through the ADT (Agence d'Attractivité Alsace), we learned more about Alsace tourism thanks to films, pictures, and lectures. Later, some members of the Union were initiated with great pomp and circumstance into the Beer Brotherhood. To conclude the evening, an excellent dinner, which included all the officials of the town and many from the region, was served at the Bartholdi Restaurant in Colmar.

Saturday the 24th was a day of leisure, allowing some 200 participants to visit Colmar, the birthplace of sculptor Frédéric-Auguste Bartholdi who created New York Harbor's famous Statue of Liberty. We were able discover or revisit this most charming city, the capital of central Alsace, with its picturesque streets, famous museums, its beautifully flowered town center, delicious gastronomy, and celebrated wines from the surrounding region. Thanks to President Staedel's organizational skills, the two days went smoothly and were a great success. Members of the New York Union Alsacienne who will be visiting their ancestral home during the month of August should reserve the last weekend of the month to participate in this festive and informative gathering.

### **Strasbourg & Alsace Bring Genuine French Christmas Magic to New York City**

The Marché de Noël de Strasbourg is coming to New York from 6 to 22 December: since 2009, it traveled around the world, from Tokyo to Moscow, Beijing, Seoul and Taipei . Organized by the municipalities of Strasbourg, Colmar and Mulhouse, it will be inaugurated 5 December in presence of the New York Mayor Bill de Blasio.

For three weeks in December, the Marché de Noël will consist of 30 Chalets, located in the southern part of Manhattan, in Bowling Green facing our Ms Liberty, the

June 6 marked the 75th anniversary of the invasion of Normandy, when Allied forces began the liberation of Western Europe. 
### The Colmar Treasure: **A Medieval Jewish Legacy**

**Exhibition Overview** 

A cache of jeweled rings, brooches, and coins—the precious possessions of a Jewish family of medieval Alsace—was hidden in the fourteenth century in the wall of a house in Colmar, France. Discovered in 1863 and on view in an exhibition at The Met Cloisters, the Colmar Treasure revives the memory of a once-thriving Jewish community that was scapegoated and put to death when the Plague struck the region with devastating ferocity in 1348–49.

Jacques Haeringer, organized a gastronomic Alsace Dinner at L'Auberge chez François, October 15 in collaboration wit the Trimbach wine, based in the picturesque town of Ribeauvillé, since 1626.

Special guest and host, Jean Trimbach, representing the 13th generation of the Trimbach family joined the event. Jacques Haeringer's invitation quoted " Papa's Alsace,

our homeland, and a beautiful wine region situated amongst the rolling hills and quaint medieval villages of northeastern France" The multi-course "dine and wine" experience included a Coquille de Crustacés, Shrimp, crabmeat, lobster, scallops, salmon, garden herb remoulade sauce served with a Trimbach Gewurztraminer 2015. It was followed by a Poached Pike Quenelle with Chanterelles, Julienne of Carrots, paired with a Trimbach Pinot Gris "Reserve Personnelle" 2014. Roulades de Sole aux Herbes, Leeks, Spätzle were paired with a Trimbach Riesling Grand Cru "Geisberg" 2013. Last but not the least, the Bettleman Grand-Mère Cécile, Grandmother's bread pudding with house made Tahitian vanilla sauce.

### **The Haeringer:** an Alsatian gastronomic dynasty!



Alsatian American Madeleine Haeringer, Executive Producer of Vice News on HBO, won several prizes at the News Emmys on Tuesday in New York. Madeleine is the daughter of Jacques Haeringer, Chef of Alsatian Auberge chez François in Washington, created 60 years ago by Francois Haeringer from Obernai.

Haeringer received his American immigration visa and moved to Washington, D.C. to work in his uncle's restaurant. He was young and spoke no English but soon mastered both the language and the palates of Americans.

He left Washington in 1950 and moved to Ketchikan, Alaska to run a hotel kitchen on the frontier. Following the birth of their first son, the family returned to Washington, D.C., where Haeringer began working at the Three Musketeers on Connecticut Ave. In 1954, he took over the restaurant, naming it Chez François. Fast forward 20+ years... instead of retiring at age 57, Haeringer decided to fulfill his dream of opening an "auberge" – a family inn prevalent in his native Alsatian countryside. After finding the perfect six acres of rolling green hills in Great Falls, L'Auberge Chez François opened

in 1976, and became a family business. Eldest son Jacques, by then a chef in his own right, became Chef de Cuisine. The dining rooms are filled with Haeringer family heirlooms and murals depicting scenes of Haeringer's home, and Papa's legacy lives on in the French countryside of Northern Virginia.

The topic of this piece is nutrition, a global health challenge especially present in Harlem, which faces problems of overweight and obesity. The project's goal is to remind the public, especially the young, that nutritious food and good eating habits help us to stay healthy.
